The prediction of January.

Ex libero animæ motu diuinam substantiam per se existentem vaticinantur.

In January shalbe the first quarter the first day at .x. a clock. xvij. minu. in the morninge great cold / with snow yse / & moisture / & shall apere worse in his first coniunctions / than towarde the end of the sayd moneth / because that al the planetes be occidental / except Mercury toward the .v. and .vi. climate. Ther shal not be very much raine / & shall begin to fayl / but the beginninge shalbe with great cold and drought / and as wel Southern as Northern winds shall blowe / which shall cause a new change of weather / so that the constitution of the yere shalbe far otherwise than the Mathematicians haue written : as wel by vnaccustomed winds / mistes / as by fleete / rain / snow / fogges / and weather full of contagiousenesse. The coniunctions of Mars & Saturne fore tell vs of great rheumatike diseses / palseis / falling sickness / pain in the side with prickinge stiches / spitteinge of bloude / and a newe sickness / that shall run almoste vnto the end of .viij. climate.

A Prognostication

mate / duringe thys moneth there shall runne a great vniuite / but it shall not be as men thought. The flanderers and then-uous shall be confounded in their expectation / all peace and tranquillitie shall be among christians except in diuites publico malo, whiche shall be troubled rather with good then with euill. Venus this yere shall be firme & constant / sauinge that some of the cuntre is wold prouoke her to make the number shorter then it is but it shall be in pain. The unworthy shall be worthy / & that shall be whiche neuer man would haue thought. And some secrete enterpryse shall be interrupted. Let vs pray vnto God by the intercession of Christe that he would not send vs that which the starres foretelle vnto vs.

The full Moone shall be the .ix. daye at one a clock .xxiij. minuts at nyght with snowe / wynde / raine / and thicke mists / ful of snares / craftes / embushes / machynations / and flouds / and riuers shall increase beyond their nature / flightes / desired works / discovered / forteresses shall be neare vnto the frontiers of the sea.

The weather shall be very straunge because

se of the great motion of the wind / which shall make the weather so chaungeable and inconstant / that certaine dayes after some Southwindes shall rise / which shall be in the nyght tyme / as well before the soune sette as after. And also at the same houres in diuers days / the weather shall be temperate and amiable. Jupiter / Mars / Venus / and Mercurye shewe more moisture than droughte. And there shall be soudaine inuasions by Pirates / Theues and robbers / and great robberies shall be done in the solstice of wynter. The earth shall be with child with innumerable frute and welth as the starres do promise vs. Nowe let vs pray and call vpon the greate eternal God / that by his grace we maye passe this yere in peace and tranquillity.
